WHAT WE ARE MADE OF

The Department of Music is housed in the recently renovated and state-of-theart Biedenharn Hall. This building houses ample classroom, studio and practice facilities in addition to the new 284-seat Emy-Lou Biedenharn Recital Hall, which boasts two 9'2" Fazioli concert grand pianos. Adjacent to Biedenharn Hall is the ULM Band Building, which contains an 8,000 square foot main rehearsal hall, an extensive band library, practice rooms, and percussion studio and rehearsal space.

WHAT WE OFFER

Music scholarships are called talent grants. These range from \$200 to \$2,000 per semester. The amount a student receives is based on audition and the needs of the individual ensembles. A student does not have to be a music major to qualify for a talent grant.

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

Directions to Biedenharn Hall from I-20 west



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LMTA OUTSTANDING TEACHER AWARD FOR 2011

Elaine Poche' is a native New Orleanian. At the age of 10, in 6th grade, she began piano lessons with Mary Calongne. She attended St. Mary's Dominican High School and in her senior year auditioned and won a scholarship to study piano with Istvan Nadas in the College of Music at Loyola University. After only a year she left school, went to work, married Paul Holmes, now deceased, and had five children. Thirteen years after leaving Elaine decided to return to Loyola and also to begin her home studio. She earned a Bachelor of Music and Master of Music studying with Dr. Janet Swanzy, then Janet Martin. Her Pedagogy teacher was James Bastien and it was from him that she received the idea of teaching private les-



sons in conjunction with group classes, the style of teaching that she carried throughout her career. Janet Swanzy was instrumental in Elaine's obtaining a graduate assistantship and this initiated her college teaching experience. She became administrator of the Loyola Preparatory Program, and after graduation continued teaching piano pedagogy as well as lessons and classes in the College, in the "Prep" department, and in her home studio in Metairie, Louisiana.

During her 21 year tenure at Loyola and 39 years as an independent piano teacher, Elaine has held several offices and chairmanships in state and local music organizations. With her former teacher and mentor Janet Swanzy, she conducted workshops such as "Tracks", "The Best of the Fest," and "Policy and Professionalism". She has attended several National Conferences on Piano Pedagogy and Preparatory Departments and Community Music Schools. For several piano teacher organizations she presented the program "Forgotten Gems", and organized the "Seminar for Parents and Piano Lessons." Her article titled "How to Teach the Downbeat" was published in Keyboard Companion. In cooperation with the LMTA Rally Board she chaired the publication of the 11th edition of the Piano Rally Syllabus. She frequently adjudicates for many contests and auditions in Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama.

In 2000 Elaine resigned from Loyola, and having moved to Bush, Louisiana in 1996 developed and maintained a small studio in the country. In 2006 Elaine married Johnny, her 8th grade/high school sweetheart. They live happily in the quiet community of Bush. She continues to this day to teach at home and in the Preparatory Program at Loyola and is active in both the New Orleans and the Northshore Music Teachers Associations.

Elaine holds the LMTA Certificate of Professional Advancement and the MTNA permanent certificate. She credits her former teachers and these two organizations for the inspiration and the structural tools necessary to have a successful studio and to produce successful students. Elaine maintains that one of the greatest joys of teaching piano is to see her students go to college to further their music education and then to enjoy careers in music. 

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2012 COMMISSIONED COMPOSER

JOE L. ALEXANDER

Joe L. Alexander grew up in Woodbridge, Virginia, a suburb of Washington, D.C. Alexander started playing music in sixth grade band where he played baritone. While in high school he switched instruments to tuba and has played it ever since. Alexander holds degrees from East Carolina University (B.M. in Music Education), James Madison Univer-

sity (M.M. in Theory/Composition), and the University of North Texas (D.M.A. in Composition), He studied composition with Newel Kay Brown, Douglas Knehans, Martin Mailman, Cindy McTee, and James Riley and tuba with James Michael Dunn.

In 2001, Alexander joined the faculty at Louisiana Tech University, where he currently is an Associate Professor of Music, and teaches Theory, Composition and Low Brass. With over 1000 performances of his original compositions and arrangements, his music has been performed throughout the United States, Ecuador and Germany. Important performances include: the International Tuba Euphonium Conference and the National Association of Composers, USA, National Conference, Bowling Green State University's annual *New Music & Art Festival*, and *New Music for Young Ensemble* Composers' Competition. In 2002, the Monroe (Louisiana) Symphony Orchestra commissioned him to compose *Louisiana Blue* (baritone voice, flute, piano with orchestra accompaniment). His *Two Bryant Songs* (soprano, Bb clarinet and piano) are recorded on the CD, *Winds and Voices*, by Living Artist Recordings.

Alexander has worked tirelessly as a promoter of new music. While in Oklahoma, he created the Nanola Performing Arts Ensemble which played new music throughout the state. This tradition continued after moving to Tuscaloosa, Alabama where he was became a member of the Birmingham Art Music Alliance. Once he joined the faculty at Louisiana Tech, he added to his responsibilities by being elected as an regional officer of the College Music Society, president of the Southeastern Composers' League and National Board member of the National Association of Composers, USA. Alexander currently serves as the National Treasurer for NACUSA and President of the Mid-South chapter of the group. Several of his composition students have won regional composition contests and later gone on graduate school to study composition and sound design at Yale University, University of Texas at Austin and Louisiana State University.



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Commissioned composer continued

Two factors inspired the composer to create *Scenes from Heinrich Heine's North Sea Pictures.* The first was being asked by the Louisiana Music Teachers Association to be their 2012 Commissioned Composer. The second was the desire by the composer to compose a piece for fellow Louisiana Tech University faculty members. Initial inspiration for the text came when the composer read Harvey Sachs' book *The Ninth: Beethoven and the World in 1824.* The book explores the arts and artists who where contemporaries of Beethoven when he composed the 9th symphony, and included a section on Heinrich Heine and his poem, *Fragen.*

Floyd's first opera Slow Dusk is a simple, powerful story set in the sand hills of the Carolinas amidst poverty and low-keyed religious fanaticism. The story unfolds around the tragedy of a May afternoon, which alters the course of a young girl's life.

Aunt Sue, a rough-hewn woman of middle age, opposes the marriage of her niece Sadie to Micah Hatfield, who lives across the pond and who belongs to the True lights, a different religious sect than the Disciples, to which Sue's family subscribes.

Sue painfully and patiently gives her niece her reasons for opposing the marriage. Music marks the passing of time from late afternoon until dusk, and in the evening, Sue reports to Sadie that Micah has drowned during the day while fishing. Jess, Sadie's brother, consoles his aunt who feels guilty from her sense of complicity.

Sadie vows fidelity to Micah's memory, mourning the emptiness of her life without him



BETH GIGANTE KLINGENSTEIN



Beth Gigante Klingenstein is nationally recognized for her practical, humorous and motivational presentations on the professional issues affecting today's music teacher. Her presentations have been well received by music teachers across the country, offering helpful insights for the seasoned professional as well as the novice.

Besides appearing at a number of state conferences, she has presented extensively at national conferences, Including the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy, Association for Technology in Music Instruction, College Music So-

ciety, National Symposium on Music Instruction Technology, National Piano Foundation, National Conference on Ubiquitous Computing, Beyond Boundaries: Integrating Technology into Teaching& Learning, and numerous presentations for Music Teachers National Association.

Klingenstein is the author of two books, A Business Guide for the Music Teacher published by Neil A. Kjos Music Company and The Independent Piano Teacher's Studio Handbook, published by Hal Leonard Corporation. She has written numerous articles, book reviews, and music reviews for American Music Teacher, Piano and Keyboard Magazine, Keyboard Companion, and The Piano Adventures Teacher.

Beth Gigante Klingenstein received a Bachelor's degree in Piano Performance from Syracuse University, a Master's degree in Piano Performance from the University of Michigan, and a PhD in Educational Leadership from the University of North Dakota. Klingenstein maintained an independent music studio for 28 years before moving to North Dakota where she is presently an Associate Professor of Music at Valley City State University. Klingenstein held the position of Founding Director of the VCSU Community School of the Arts for fifteen years and has served as a community leader in arts advocacy throughout her career in music. Klingenstein is a Nationally Certified Teacher of Music and is the current president of the North Dakota Music Teachers Association.

VICTOR LABENSKE



Victor Labenske is professor of music at Point Loma Nazarene University in San Diego, California, where he teaches courses in piano, music history and composition. A summa cum laude graduate of PLNU, he earned his master's degree in piano performance at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, Conservatory of Music where he studied with Joanne Baker. He also earned the Doctor of Musical Arts in piano performance at the University of Southern California where he studied

with Stewart Gordon.

He has been honored with such distinctions as playing in the opening ceremonies of the 1984 Olympic Games and being named an Academic All-American Scholar. His compositional output, over 500 published compositions and arrangements, includes sacred piano collections, educational piano music, and also music for violin and piano, voice and piano, and handbells. Dr. Labenske remains active as a concert artist both as soloist and as a collaborative performer and enjoys presenting sacred concerts with his wife: soprano, Judith Spaite Labenske. The Labenskes have two children, Karlin and Kristofer.

and a fine leader who was instrumental in building the LMTA areas of strings and harp.

She served on the String Rally Board from 1994 to 1998, serving as String Rally Chair from 1996 to 1998 when the Rally was temporarily dissolved. She was Instrumental in the first revision of the String Rally Syllabus, making it more approachable to both teachers and students.

Shirley served on the Harp Rally Board from 1994 to

2006, and served as both Harp Chair and Harp Rally Chair from 1998-2006. She was one of the major forces in the development of the Harp Rally Syllabus and the organizer of many fine harp presentations at state conventions.

In 2001 she assumed the office of Historian which she held until 2006. She was at every convention taking photos of activities and took pride in organizing them into an amazing scrapbook. This information has been archived in the LMTA collection at the LSU Archives.



Her college studies of music theory began her quest to effectively integrate music theory into her younger student's curriculum. She has enjoyed teaching piano for the past 30 years and currently maintains two independent piano studios in Salt Lake City where she actively serves as UMTA Independent Music Teacher Forum Chair. She is the mother of five and grandmother of three.

Dr. Simon Shiao is a string professor and conductor of the University of North Florida Orchestra. From 2005-2007, Dr. Shiao held the title of the Gerson Yessin Distinguished Professor of Music at the University of North Florida. A versatile performer, he holds the distinction of having performed at Carnegie Hall in three different capacities; as a recitalist, and with both string quartet and orchestra.




