Keith continued his education at Louisiana Tech University in Ruston, LA with low brass professor Dr. Joe L. Alexander. He attended La Tech from 2003-2008 pursuing a Bachelor of Music Education degree. While at La Tech, Keith was principal tuba with the Symphonic Wind Ensemble, Chamber Orchestra, Brass Quintet, and Brass Choir. He also played bass trombone in the Symphonic Band and Jazz Band, and euphonium in a Tuba/Euphonium Quartet. In 2009, Keith continued his studies at Louisiana College in Pineville, LA, where he studied tuba with Dr. Karl Carpenter and conducting with Mr. Andrew Hunter. During that year, Keith was the Principal Tuba for the Monroe Symphony Orchestra in Monroe, LA. In 2010, He completed a Bachelor of Arts in Music degree from Thomas Edison State College in Trenton, New Jersey. After graduating, Keith was the Band Director at Arthur F. Smith Middle Magnet School in Alexandria, LA and Marksville High School in Marksville, LA. In 2015, he started pursuing a Master of Music Performance degree at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, LA. Keith is studying tuba performance with bass trombonist and former Arnold Jacobs' student Dr. J. Mark Thompson and conducting with Dr. Jeffrey Mathews. He currently is a member of the Wind Symphony, student conductor of the Magale Concert Band, Tuba/Euphonium Ensemble, Trombone Choir, and the NSULA Tuba/Euph Quartet.
